Tuscarora Managed Care Alliance (TMCA) recently received approval for a retroactive supplemental payment to certain providers in accordance with OMHSAS Policy Clarification #03-2012. The disbursement of funds will occur by mid-September 2016, and will be accompanied by an individual letter to all impacted providers. The payments will be made to all qualifying providers that are in-network with PerformCare for Franklin-Fulton Members. This one-time TMCA payment is based on the set of performance measures listed below and is in recognition of the initiative and hard work of providers that produced excellent results that have been achieved in these measures.

- **PA Specific Ambulatory Follow-Up Visits after Hospitalization:** Variable payments will be made for meeting 7 day, 14 day, or 30 day follow-up visits. Payments will be made to both the discharging Mental Health Inpatient provider, and the Mental Health / Substance Abuse Outpatient Community Based providers of the follow-up service. The total amount of payment that TMCA is making available, to be shared among all impacted providers, is \$236,000.
- **Mental Health Inpatient 30 day Readmission rate:** Variable payments will be made to discharging hospitals based on the number of successful discharges of Members who maintained community tenure without readmission for at least 30 days. The total amount of payment that TMCA is making available, to be shared among all impacted providers, is \$227,050.

This Provider Notice is to make you aware of the chosen performance measures that will be used to calculate this supplemental rate adjustment, and to anticipate that letters and payments will arrive in September.

Both incentives are directed towards continuity of care and discharge planning between facility-based and community-based providers. We encourage all providers to continue to closely collaborate and address these important transition points for Members.
