

Parents of children who have just been diagnosed with ASD often feel overwhelmed.

Some are relieved to have a name to explain what they were worried about. It is very important that you know the things you can do to help yourself and your child. You and your child can develop the skills to reach their fullest potential and participate in their family, school, and community. By educating yourself, you will be able to make wise decisions, advocate for your child, and help educate others. To do this, you need reliable information.

There are several signs that a child may be at risk for autism. Autism, also known as autism spectrum disorder (ASD), describes a condition that affects social interactions, communication, and other behaviors. ASD begins in early childhood and lasts throughout a person's life. People with ASD may show many of the same symptoms, but it can have different severity and impact for different people. This is why ASD is considered a spectrum disorder. Knowing the signs, what to do, and where to get help is critical.

Autism: Help for Families Franklin and Fulton counties

There are several signs that a child may be at risk for a developmental disability called autism.

Autism, also known as autism spectrum disorder (ASD), describes a group of brain disorders that affect social interactions, communication and other behaviors. Signs include delayed speech patterns or no speech. Children at risk for autism can be of any gender. They may avoid contact with others and play with things in an unusual way, such as spinning toys or staring at lights or fans.

If your child has these or other unusual behaviors, they may have autism.

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To learn more or get help:

- Talk to your pediatrician or family doctor. Ask for testing to rule out other problems, such as a hearing disorder, seizure disorder or developmental delay.
- Make an appointment with a developmental pediatrician, child psychiatrist or child psychologist. Your doctor or local hospital can help you find one.
- If your child is under age 3, call your county's Early Intervention program. Their contact information can be found on the other side of this brochure. Ask for an evaluation by the local Early Intervention program. Your child does not have to be diagnosed with autism to have the evaluation. It can be done in your home at no cost to you.
- If your child is older than age 3, call your intermediate unit (IU). Phone numbers for the IU serving your area can be found on the other side of this brochure.
- Parents who have questions about their child's development may also call the CONNECT Helpline at 1-800-692-7288. The CONNECT Helpline assists families in locating resources and providing information regarding child development for children from birth to age 5. In addition, CONNECT can assist parents by making a direct link to their county Early Intervention program or local preschool Early Intervention program.

Remember: While your child does not need to be diagnosed with autism to get help, an accurate and early autism diagnosis can provide the basis for an appropriate educational and treatment program.

If your child is diagnosed with autism, they are able to receive benefits to pay for needed services. According to the Autism Insurance Act, many private insurance companies (as well as Medical Assistance) are required to cover the cost of the diagnostic assessment and treatment of ASD for those under the age of 21. To apply for Medical Assistance, contact the County Assistance Office (CAO) for the county where you live to find out how to apply. Staff at the CAO can help you

complete the form. You can also apply online at www.compass.dhs.pa.gov/home/#/.

When your child receives Medical Assistance and is a member of PerformCare, you can call us toll-free at the numbers listed in this brochure. Support for families is critical.
