**Policy:** Establishes protocols for payment of skills training and

development for Intensive Behavioral Health Services (IBHS)

specific to new Behavioral Health Technician (BHT).

**Purpose:** To assure that network providers have a process for payment for

BHT/BHT-ABA skills training and development for new staff.

**Definitions:** ABA: Applied Behavior Analysis, which is the design,

implementation, and evaluation of environmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and consequences, to produce socially significant improvement in human behavior or to prevent loss of attained skill on function by including the use of direct

attained skill or function by including the use of direct

observation, measurement and functional analysis of the relations

between environment and behavior.

**IBHS:** Intensive Behavioral Health Services, which is an array of therapeutic interventions and supports provided to a child, youth, or young adult in the home, school, or other community setting.

**Acronyms: BHT:** Behavioral Health Technician

**BHT-ABA:** Behavioral Health Technician-Applied Behavior

Analysis

**Procedure:** 1. Skills training and development for newly hired BHT and

BHT-ABA staff does not require prior authorization.

Specifically, BHT should be billed separately as Procedure Code H2014UB, while BHT-ABA should be billed as Procedure Code 97153 (as part of the Member's approved

BHT-ABA authorization). Services are billable for a

maximum of six (6) hours per staff following service provision.

2. Prior to a BHT/BHT- ABA staff working independently with a Member, skill development and training must be provided onsite while delivering authorized BHT/BHT-ABA services to an eligible Member under the supervision of a qualified supervisor, per IBHS regulations.
